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William Starbuck is courtesy professor-in-residence at the Lundquist College of Business of the University of Oregon and professor emeritus at New York University. He received his M.S. and Ph.D. in industrial administration at Carnegie Institute of Technology, after receiving an A.B. in physics at Harvard. He also received a Ph.D. honoris causa in social science from Stockholm University and the title Docteur honoris causa from both the Université Panthéon-Assas (Paris II) and the Université Paul Cézanne (Aix-Marseille III).

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He has been the editor of *Administrative Science Quarterly*, chaired the screening committee for senior Fulbright awards in business management, directed the doctoral program in business administration at New York University, and he was the President of the Academy of Management. He is a member of the Council of the Society for the Advancement of Management Studies.

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He currently serves on the editorial boards of the Asian Case Research Journal, Information and Organization, the International Journal of Management Reviews, the Journal of Management Studies, Organization Management Journal, and the Scandinavian Journal of Management. He is a fellow of the Academy of Management, the American Psychological Association, the Association for Psychological Science, the British Academy of Management, and the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology, and a member of Sigma Xi.

He has published over 160 articles on accounting, bargaining, business strategy, computer programming, computer simulation, forecasting, decision making, human-computer interaction, learning, organizational design, organizational growth and development, perception, scientific methods, and social revolutions. He has also written two books and edited 17 books, including the two-volume *Handbook of Organizational Design*, which was chosen the best book on management published during 1982. His 2006 book, *The Production of Knowledge*, reflects on lessons from his own academic journey and on the challenges associated with management and social science research.
